Over 215,000 Sacramento residents and over 104,000 children don't get enough food to eat. They are unable to access affordable, nutritious food.

College students are also vulnerable. One out of four college students need support for food and basic necessities.

Pre-COVID, Sac State's Food Pantry estimated that 11,000 students and their families would need assistance in 2021.
