Grants might include paying car registration fees and car repair costs, helping with job training supplies or education fees, funding dental work, helping with utility bills, and much more.

When are BTS Grants available?

Grants are made quarterly at the end of each WE nine-week session. Grants are also provided at any time of the year for timesensitive, urgent needs.



What is Bridge to Success (BTS)?

NCJW Sacramento created BTS in December 2015 to award mini-grants to graduates of Women's Empowerment's (WE) nine-week program and help them move toward self-sufficiency.

Grants are provided to graduates who are facing financial challenges and need help with a one-time expense that prevents the applicant from securing safe housing, job training, education, or employment.

Who is eligible?

All graduates of Women's Empowerment's nine-week session, both past and present, are eligible to receive a BTS grant.

How to apply

Contact any Women's Empowerment (WE) staff member for an application form, complete it thoroughly, and attach all requested items.

Some examples of grants that have been made (names have been changed for confidentiality) to graduates of BTS include:

- Vicki who was diligently looking for work and was at risk of losing her electricity and gas if she did not make a payment on her utility bill
- Constance who had an uninhabitable living situation with her 11-year-old autistic daughter and needed help with a portion of her rental deposit and for the cost of a U-Haul to move
- Brenda who needed assistance to repair her car to maintain her job and get her children to and from school.
